

This is a guide for copying mailbox data from one Pegasus Mail installation to another. This is not a complete file guide. Use it at your own risk. Please read completely before starting.

Common files that exist in a mailbox directory on all systems:

*.CNM files	These are raw new mail message files, one per message
*.PMM/*PMI file pairs	These are the message folder files
*.PMR/*PM! file pairs	These are address book files, user or system wide
WINPMFUA.PM	This is the recently used address list

Files that may exist in a mailbox directory if these functions were used:

*.PMN files	These are annotation files - cannot be reconnected - lost on reindex
*.PMO/*PNX files	Saved draft messages/stationary plain/formatted versions
*.PML files	These are distribution list files (black.pml & white.pml are default)
*.PMC	These are filter rule files - 7 different types
IMAP.PM	Contains IMAP profiles (there may not be one)
SIGNAMES.PM	Contains the names of the signature files (there may not be one)
LOCALS*.PMS	Signature files per user and per Identity (there may not be any)
LOCALS*.PNS	Signature files, formatted version (there may not be any)
INETSIG*.PMS	Signature files (there may not be any)
INETSIG*.PNS	Signature files, formatted version (there may not be any)
MHSSIG*.PMS	Signature files (there may not be any)

Optional files that may exist in a mailbox directory to consider copying:

USRDICTIONARY.PMD	Contains user added dictionary words
SPAM*.DAT	Contain info used by Content Control
*.PNC	Content Control set definition
SYSLOG.PM	Log of all outgoing mail messages when activated
GLOSSARY.PM	Saved Glossary entries.
*.PND	Contain POP3 and SMTP configurations and settings, one file for each configured host. Creating new ones is recommended.

Do not overwrite the following configuration files:

PMAIL.INI	Note: This file contains most of the configuration settings. The one in the old mailbox can be viewed with a text editor for reference.
